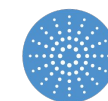
# About The Coalition

**Our Vision:** Every Californian and their care teams have the information and insights they need to make care seamless, high quality and affordable



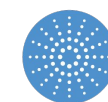
## Policy Priorities

- **Integration of social services data:** Develop and communicate case studies and policy recommendations that support cross-sector data sharing, consent, and authorization

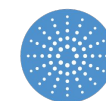

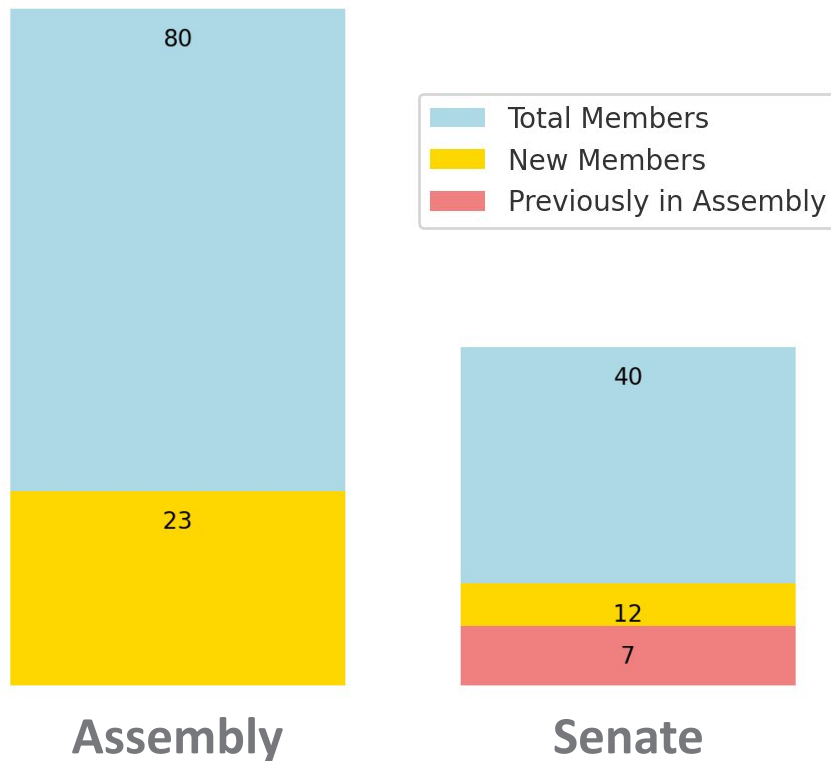

# 2025 Sacramento Legislative Outlook

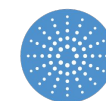
## Composition of California Legislature (2025-26 Session)



- 28 new state legislators
- **Leadership turnover:** Assemblymember Bonta will continue as Assembly Health Chair, but awaiting leadership assignments for Senate Health and Appropriations
- **Members are limited to 35 bills for the two-year session:** Previously 50 in the Assembly and 40 in the Senate

# Final 2025 Policy Priorities



## Establish DxF Governance and Accountability

Engage in DxF policy development and provide critical feedback to state legislative and regulatory leadership to realize the full promise of AB 133.



## Identify Dedicated and Sustained Funding Streams

Support continued and coordinated funding for health and social services data sharing and encourage state agencies to actively seek federal match and/or other funding sources when and where appropriate.



## Strengthen Social Services Data Sharing

Improve cross-sector data sharing through the development of priority use cases and policy advancements that support consent management, standards alignment, and capacity building for social services data sharing.



## Advance High-Quality and Actionable Data Sharing

Support focused efforts that enhance the completeness, accuracy, and timeliness of data sharing to transform data usability and drive better outcomes.

## Coalition Feedback on 2025 Policy Priorities

- 1. Calls for DxF governance and accountability**  
“Establishing DXF governance and accountability is overdue if full participation is wanted and expected.”
- 2. Support for public funding and growing social services data sharing**
- 3. High-quality and actionable data sharing to address DxF barriers**  
“Address[ing] the most pressing implementation roadblocks is paramount in the short-term to ensure long-term success” in the context of interoperability with EHRs and provider capacity to engage
- 4. Reminders to balance patient privacy and security**  
Comments in relation to proposed statewide centralization plans of information, accountability for state privacy laws, and integrity of data governance practices in seeking federal funding post 2024-election

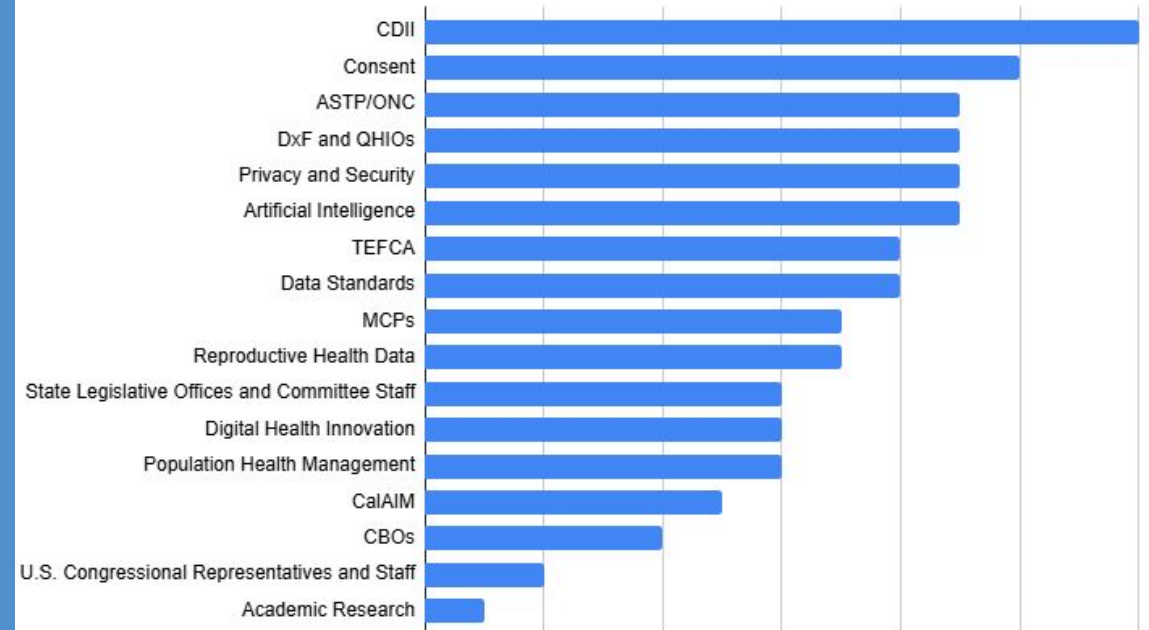

# ASTP/ONC Update: Publication of Final HTI-2 Rule

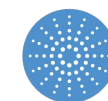


ASTP/ONC has released the Health Data, Technology, and Interoperability: Trusted Exchange Framework and Common Agreement (HTI-2) Final Rule to finalize proposals related to TEFCA.

Highlights include:

- The TEFCA Manner Exception for information blocking
- Strengthens TEFCA reliability, privacy, security and trust

## Common Themes & General Comments ([Access C4BH's Comments Here](#))

- **Cross-Pillar Tenets and Shared Use Cases:** Greater integration of pillar tenets for a more holistic approach to DxF Roadmap implementation and a recommendation to develop use cases that are applicable and can be tested and across all pillars.
- **Prioritizing Equity:** Health equity should be incorporated in all DxF Roadmap recommendations, in addition to a greater recognition of the role of CBOs. Meaningful support and engagement of CBOs is critical in advancing equity through the DxF.

# C4BH DxF Roadmap Public Comment

## Highlights

- **Event Notification Pillar**
  - ***Defining Event-Based Notification:*** Define additional use cases for event notifications beyond hospital notifications that may qualify as an event. C4BH looks to align with CDII Standards Committee conversations pertaining to standardizing minimum data sets and expanding a list of standardized data elements for event notifications.
- **Social Service Data Strategy Pillar**
  - ***Leveraging Existing Funding Sources:*** Identify current funding streams that can be utilized to incentivize data exchange and have a stronger alignment of data exchange requirements and milestones across state funding opportunities (e.g. CalAIM and CDPH grant programs).
- **Consent Management Pillar**
  - ***Distinction Between Identity Management and Consent:*** Consider separate governance and oversight for the two. In addition, clarify the scope of Identity Management, implement a state digital identity strategy, and prioritize implementation of a statewide person index.
- **Participant Engagement Pillar**
  - ***Required Signatory Definitions:*** Clarify language regarding mandatory DSA signatories, specifically for “Provider Organization and Medical Groups” and consider additional signatory types that could be mandatory.

# CDII Centralized Roster Service RFI: Responses Due December 20

## Centralized Roster Service Purpose

- Expand event-based exchange by ensuring the right information reaches the right entities in a timely manner
- Support accurate and up-to-date roster management to help DxF Participants request notifications for individuals in their care and to determine where to route notifications
- The solution is *not* intended to be a comprehensive ADT routing system
- Solutions are intended to support admissions and discharges from hospitals, EDs, and SNFs but this could expand to other types of events in the future



## RFI Details ([Access the RFI Here](#))

- **Seeking vendor approaches to a centralized roster service:** general architecture, technology requirements, person-matching capabilities, governance, roster standards, costs & funding, and mechanisms to submit and access rosters to route events

# CDII Centralized Roster Service RFI: C4BH Point of View

- C4BH will respond to the RFI with high-level priorities from our [letter to CDII on the Statewide Strategy for Digital Identities](#)
- **Person Matching:** Yes, the centralized roster service should include patient matching capabilities. A statewide person index that serves as a Record Locator Service would be of great value and support the integration of social services data necessary for initiatives such as CalAIM.
- **Governance:** C4BH believes investing in the governance of a centralized roster service and overarching digital identities strategy is paramount. We recommend developing in partnership with efforts to advance overall DxP governance.



# DxF Data Elements to Be Exchanged P&P Amendment: Public Comment Due January 2

Based on recommendations from the 2024 Standards and Implementation Advisory Committees, CDII proposes P&P amendments to automatically align the DxF with federally-required versions of the USCDI data standards.

**What does this mean?** DxF Participants will begin using USCDI version 3 on January 1, 2026 with future version updates determined by ASTP/ONC.

**C4BH will submit public comments in agreement with CDII's proposed P&P amendment.**

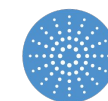
# ACF Development of Interoperability Standards for Human Service Programs RFI: Responses Due December 27



The HHS Administration for Children and Families (ACF) seeks information on the most effective approaches, technical standards, and technological tools that currently or could promote interoperability between health and human services.

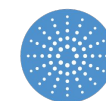

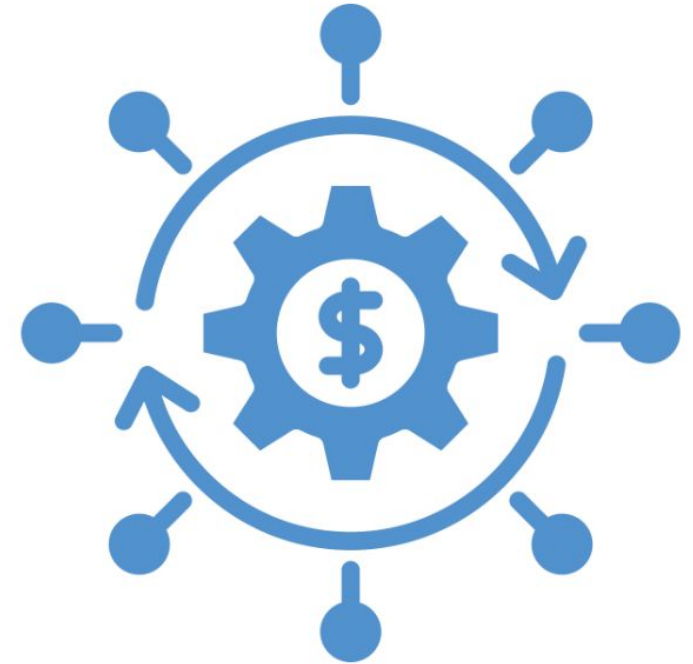

## Congress Introduces Legislation to Strengthen Health Care Cybersecurity

U.S. Senators Wyden (D-OR) and Warner (D-VA) introduced the [Health Infrastructure Security and Accountability Act](#) in response to growing cyberattacks and digitization of health information. The bill would require HHS to establish strengthened security standards for HIPAA covered entities and business associates, require annual risk assessments and audits, set civil monetary penalties, and provide funding to support hospital adoption of cybersecurity practices.
